Aptus and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

Aptus strives to make it as easy as possible for our customers to meet the requirements of the General Data Protection Regulation in force as of 25/05/2018. We are continuously reviewing the functionality of our software, improving our internal processes and developing contracts for customers when we act as Data Processor of personal data.

THE PERSONAL DATA ACT AND GDPR

Aptus software currently has functions for automatically anonymizing and deleting logs in order to comply with the Swedish Personal Data Act. It has support for registering consent for the storage of access logs when keys are issued, and to give access logs from apartment doors a higher level of protection. This provides a good basis for compliance with GDPR. These functions were introduced in version 7.11 during 2008 in Multiaccess and Hantera Styra. To reduce the risk of staff entering unnecessary personal data in the system, you can hide the Free Text field in Hantera Styra.

NEW VERSION IN SPRING

Version 8.8 of our software, due for release in spring 2018, will have new functions that improve data protection. This makes it easier for you, as a controller of personal data, to comply with GDPR.

IMPROVEMENTS IN MULTIACCESS STYRA AND HANTERA STYRA

- Improved template for consent in conjunction with the issuing of keys. Among other things, the template provides more information for the tenant, and separate signatures are required for consent and receipt. Note that the template must always be modified by entering data relevant to each system owner.
- Function for anonymizing and deleting logs when a person requests to have personal data deleted.
- Support for extraction of personal data.
- Improved settings for anonymizing and deleting access logs and booking logs.

IMPORTANT INTERNAL PROCESSES

GDPR is largely concerned with internal processes on site. Companies that are responsible for personal data, for instance regarding Access Control Systems or Property IT Systems, need to ensure that staff manage personal data correctly. This regards, among other things, having legal grounds for processing the data, keeping check of which personal data are processed and in what situations, only processing the data necessary for the stated purpose, deleting data that are no longer necessary, and informing the registered persons and, if necessary, obtaining their consent.
